Miss Fuller, whose parents are Indian, worked for the Jaeger fashion chain at a designer outlet near Bridgend. But Joel was out of work and had been treated for stress and depression.

tual brick" in a remembrance wall.


Natasha's Bebo site featured a tribute to Liam Clarke, 20, who was found hanging in a park last December 27.

We've all got plenty to live for."

She said: "Luke's death has ripped the heart out of this family.
"We have no idea why he did it but I don't want any other family to go through what we've been through.
"He was hanging from the frame of a wardrobe we were getting fitted. He'd used a dressing gown cord. I had to cut him down. That image will stay with me for ever. I can only put Luke's actions down to can only put Luke's actions down to a moment of madness because he

had everything to live for."
All the 14 victims are under the age of 27 and many were known to

each other.
