X-FACTOR bosses have been accused of manipulating a young contestant from Bridgend by asking her to play up her hometown's suicide rate. Alexandra Davies, 17,

appeared on the ITV1 show last Saturday and won through to the next round.

Before going on she claims she was told to mention the spate of youth suicides in Bridgend – even though she doesn't know anyone affected. Alexandra said afterwards:

"They thought that up when I said I was from Bridgend.

"The producers wanted me to talk about it but I didn't want to just in case I offended someone's family.

"I would rather be known for my talent than the girl that comes from the suicide town."

Darren Matthews, director of Bridgend Samaritans, said it "trivialised" the tragedies.

An ITV spokeswoman said: "There was no pressure placed on Alexandra during filming. Nor did she, or her parents, raise any concerns about her interview.
